IN THE MATTER OF ENACTING AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE
CUTTING OF COUNTY ROADS FOR ANY WATER LINE OR PIPE LINE
PURPOSE WITHOUT WRITTEN PERMISSION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

WHEREAS, County Roads have heretofore been cut, at will, for the laying of water lines, causing either a slump to be left in the road or a mound to be left in the road, each causing a hazard to traffic traveling said road,

NOW, THEREFORE, Supervisor Freddie Wall moved that the following ordinance be adopted, said motion being seconded by Supervisor A. Marks:

"ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE CUTTING OF A
COUNTY ROAD FOR WATER LINE OR
PIPE LINE PURPOSES WITHOUT THE
WRITTEN PERMISSION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

It shall be unlawful for any person, company, corporation, or association to cut the surface of a Pike County Road for the purpose of laying a water line or pipe line without the express written permission, in advance, of the Pike County Board of Supervisors. Any person, company, corporation, or association who cuts a Pike County Road for the purposes of laying a water line or pipe line without the advance express written permission of the Board of Supervisors of Pike County, or orders the same to be done, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined up to the sum of \$500.00.

SO ORDERED, October 4th, 1984.
