THE LOADING OF LOG TRUCKS OR PULPWOOD TRUCKS IN

THE PUBLIC ROADS OF PIKE COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI

AND PROHIBITING THE LEAVING OF LIMBS OR TREETOPS

IN THE DITCHES OR RIGHT-OF-WAYS OF

THE PUBLIC ROADS

WHEREAS, members of this Board have observed the loading of pulpwood and log trucks in the public roads of the County and the throwing, dumping, or leaving of limbs and treetops from said logging or pulpwooding operation in the ditches and on right-of-ways of the public roads, and

WHEREAS, it appears unto this Board that such practices constitute a safety hazard to the citizens traveling the public roads of the County and further create an eyesore, detracting from the scenery in the County,

NOW, THEREFORE, upon motion duly made and seconded, the following ordinance was proposed for adoption:

PULPWOOD ONTO TRUCKS IN THE PUBLIC ROADS OF

PIKE COUNTY AND PROHIBITING THE DUMPING,

THROWING, OR LEAVING OF LIMBS AND TREETOPS IN

THE DITCHES AND ON THE RIGHT-OF-WAYS OF

PUBLIC ROADS IN PIKE COUNTY

It shall be unlawful for any person to load or unload logs or pulpwood onto or from trucks located in the public roads of Pike County, Mississippi.

It shall be further unlawful for any person to throw, leave, or abandon treetops or limbs from such logging operation into the ditches or onto the right-of- ways of the public roads in Pike County.

The penalty for violation of this ordinance, upon conviction, shall be that of a misdemeanor.

This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after passage.
