AN ORDINANCE AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PIKE COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI REQUIRING ALL HOMES AND PLACES OF BUSINESS LOCATED WHERE A SYSTEM OF SANITARY SEWERS IS AVAILABLE TO PROPERLY CONNECT TO SAID SEWER SYSTEM

BE IT ORDAINED AND ORDERED by this Board, as the governing authority of Pike County, Mississippi, as follows:

SECTION ONE: In accordance with Section I, Item 2 of the regulations governing disposal of human excreta and other liquid waste of the Mississippi State Department of Health, all property owners subject to the provision of this article shall be those whose property abuts on a street where a line of a sanitary sewage system is located, or which is within a distance of two hundred (200) feet from the line where sanitary sewage is located shall have installed one (1) or more sanitary water closets connected with said sewer system, provided there is sufficient fall to provide gravity flow from said property to said sewage system. Said connections shall be made at the expense of the property owner. No property owner shall be required to extend the existing sanitary sewage system in order to make the connection required by this ordinance.

SECTION TWO: Applications for sewage connections shall be made in the City of McComb utility office in the McComb City Hall. All sewage connections shall be inspected by the City of McComb prior to their being buried.

SECTION THREE: The violation of this ordinance and order shall be that of a misdemeanor, punishable by fine or fine and county jail time or county jail time as the Justice Court shall deem appropriate.

SECTION FOUR: That a copy of this ordinance and order shall be published for three (3) consecutive weeks in a newspaper published and circulated in Pike County. That this ordinance and order shall take effect and be in force after the eighth day following the last publication authorized herein.

The above and foregoing ordinance and order having been introduced and read at a public meeting of this Board held on the 17th day of May, A.D., 1988, was considered, passed, and adopted, Section by Section, and then as a whole, by the following vote:
