IN THE MATTER OF ADOPTING AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING FERNWOOD
RESIDENTS TO CONNECT TO THE FERNWOOD SEWER SYSTEM

WHEREAS, this Board considered a photostatic copy of a letter from Mr. Bruce A. Rawls of the Mississippi State Department of Health dated October 12, 1987 to the City of McComb which letter discusses the state law requirement that residents of the Baertown Community connect to the available sewer, and

WHEREAS, the same laws which apply to the residents of the Baertown Community will also apply to the residents of the Fernwood Community, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Board adopt an ordinance requiring Fernwood residents to connect to the Fernwood sewer system to comply with state law,

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Supervisor Freddie Wall, seconded by Supervisor A. Marks, and carried by the affirmative vote of all five (5) Supervisors, the Board adopted the following ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING FERNWOOD COMMUNITY RESIDENTS TO CONNECT
TO THE FERNWOOD SEWER SYSTEM

WHEREAS, Mississippi State Health Department regulations governing disposal of human excreta and other liquid waste, Section 1, Item 2 requires "all such homes and places mentioned in Item 1 of this Regulation located on streets or alleys where a system of sanitary sewers is available shall have a properly constructed sewer connection to said sewer system into which all human excreta shall be disposed", and

WHEREAS, Section 41-67-7, MCA, 1972, Annotated, Section 3 requires likewise that a connection be made where a sewer is available,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Pike County, as follows:

SECTION 1: In connection to sewer required. All property owners and residents residing in the Fernwood Community whose property abuts on a street where a line of the Fernwood sanitary sewage is located, or which is

within a distance of two hundred feet (200') from the line where a sanitary sewage is located shall have installed one or more sanitary water closets (commodes) connected with said sewer system, provided there is sufficient fall to provide gravity flow from said property to said sewage system.

SECTION 2: The effective date of this ordinance shall be immediately following publication.

SO PASSED AND ADOPTED, first as to Sections, then as a whole, at the October 13, 1988 regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Pike County by the following vote:


