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AN ORDINANCE FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE PIKE COUNTY ENHANCED 911 EMERGENCY RESPONSE SYSTEM

Be it ordained by the Board of Supervisors of Pike County, Mississippi, and it is hereby ordained by said Board as follows:

1. NEW STRUCTURES AND MOBILE HOMES

- a) All persons, firms, corporations and other legal entities constructing new structures, locating or re-locating mobile homes, and changing the location of their physical address (e.g.a. renter), in Pike County, Mississippi, shall from and after this date obtain an address notification form, which shall be in the following form:

- b) No utility company operating in Pike County, Mississippi, shall furnish its utility services to

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any new structure or mobile home, including a mobile home that is moved from one location to another, until it has been furnished with information contained on the address notification form duly issued by the authorities, as set out hereinbelow.

- c) Applicant shall apply for the Address Notification Form at the Pike County Emergency Communication Commission, 310 Canal Street, McComb, Mississippi and the Emergency Communication Commission shall furnish the applicant with sufficient copies to present to the utility companies and to the United States Post Office and to the Office of the Pike County Tax Assessor.
- d) Upon request for the Address Notification Form, the Address Issuance Officer shall assign a number and address to the structure. The Emergency Communication Commission shall keep a record of all numbers and addresses assigned.

2. POSTING OF DESIGNATED HOUSE NUMBERS

The owner or occupant or person in charge of any house, building, mobile home or other structure to which a number has been assigned

- (a) Shall within 30 days after the receipt of such number affix the number in a conspicuous place.
- (b) Remove any different number which might be mistaken for or confused with the number assigned to said structure by the issuing authority.
- (c) Each principal building or structure shall display the number assigned to the frontage on which the front entrance is located. In case the principal building or structure is occupied by more than one business or family dwelling unit, each separate front entrance may display a separate number.
- (d) Numerals indicating the official numbers for each principal building, or each front entrance to such building, shall be posted in a manner as to be legible and distinguishable from the street or road on which the property is located, with numbers painted or applied, of not less than FOUR INCHES (4") in height.
- (e) Mail boxes shall be marked with the house number.
- (f) If the structure is not visible from the street or road on which it is located with no mail box beside the driveway leading to the structure, a sign or number post

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shall be erected to display the number which may be displayed either vertically from the top down or horizontally.

3. APPLICANT LOCATION IDENTIFICATION RESPONSIBILITY

The applicant shall be responsible for providing the information regarding the location of the structure or mobile home to the Address Issuance Office with the Emergency Communication Commission.

4. In the event that the owner or occupant or person in charge of any house or building refuses to comply with the terms of this ordinance by failing to affix the number assigned within sixty days (60) after the notification, or by failing within said period of sixty (60) days to remove any old numbers affixed to such house, or house entrance, or elsewhere, which may be confused with the number assigned thereto, he shall be punished by paying a fine of not less than ten (10) dollars for every day that the situation is not rectified.
5. This ordinance is limited to structures in Pike County, Mississippi, lying outside the corporate limits of the Cities of McComb and Magnolia and corporate limits of the Towns of Summit and Osyka.
6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
8. The Clerk of this Board is directed to publish this ordinance in the Enterprise-Journal one time, to obtain a proof of publication thereof and to file said proof in the Minutes of this board.
