# IN THE MATTER OF AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING CONCRETE WASTE OR MATERIALS ON PUBLIC STREETS, ROADS, AND IN PUBLIC PLACES OF PIKE COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI

The Board of Supervisors has received information from affected and interested persons regarding an ordinance to prohibit the placement or deposit of concrete litter on public roads and streets in unincorporated areas of Pike County, Mississippi.

On discussion, the Board determined that concrete waste and rubbish, if deposited on or about public roads and streets, tends to create a danger to the public health, safety, and welfare.

The Board of Supervisors determined that the depositing of concrete waste or rubbish in unincorporated areas on or about public streets or roads, should be made illegal, and that fines should be prescribed therefor.

On motion by Supervisor Lexie Elmore, seconded by Supervisor Tazwell Bowsky, the following resolution was duly adopted:

<u>LITTERING OF CONCRETE WASTE OR REFUSE ON PUBLIC PROPERTY</u>

<u>PROHIBITED</u>:

No person shall dump, deposit, drop, discard, leave, cause or permit the dumping, depositing, dropping, discarding, or leaving of concrete waste, rubbish, or litter on or about any public road, street, or any public property in the unincorporated portions of this County unless the property has been designated by the County for the disposal of litter.

### PENALTY:

Any person, firm, or corporation violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be

fined, on conviction, not more than \$500.00 for each offense.
